

STATEMENT CONCERNING SCHOLARSHIPS & BURSARIES  
AWARDED AT CARMEL COLLEGE.

Each year Carmel College awards a number of free places (described as Scholarships) and places at reduced fees (described as Bursaries) on a competitive basis. The announcement of this Scholarship and Bursary Examination is announced in the Jewish Chronicle in March and the Examination takes place in April or early May. The factors that are taken into consideration in granting these awards are :-

1. The ability of the boy.
2. The boy's need for Carmel College.
3. The financial means of the parents.

The situation at present, January 1958, is -

18 boys have free places and pay no fees at all.

7 boys pay £300 per annum - a reduction of £75

14 boys pay £250 per annum - a reduction of £125

19 boys pay £200 per annum - a reduction of £175

7 boys pay £150 per annum - a reduction of £225

5 boys pay £100 per annum - a reduction of £275.

The total therefore receiving Scholarships and Bursaries at Carmel College is 70. The total School population is 240.

We constantly receive applications from parents who wish to send their boys to Carmel College but cannot pay the full fees. In some cases, after examining the boy, we feel that it is urgent that he should enter Carmel College with the minimum of delay (as, for example, if the boy is living in an area where he has no Jewish environment whatsoever) we admit him and do not ask him to wait until the next year's Scholarship and Bursary Examination. In other cases we ask the boys to wait until the following April when the competitive Examination will take place. We already have 20 names of boys who have applied to come to Carmel College on reduced fees and I do not doubt that when the annual announcement is made in the Jewish Chronicle, we will have at least another 20 applicants. This means that we shall have no less than 40, and possibly considerably more, who wish to come to Carmel College next year, either for free places or on reduced fees.
