### CARMEL COLLEGE BURSAR

Captain Henry S. Lunzer who, as recently announced in this paper has been appointed resident bursar at Carmel College, Wallingford, has had an interesting and varied career. Born and educated in London, Mr. Lunzer, after a period of study at the Yeshiva in Frankfort, embarked on a commercial career, and in 1935 emigrated to Palestine as it then was. During the war he served in the British and Indian armies rising from the ranks to Company Commander and Adjutant, later serving as Staff Captain on a Corps headquarters. On demobilisation Mr. Lunzer was appointed Field Director for Germany of the Jewish Relief Unit, and on relinquishing this post in 1947 took a diploma in Public Administration at the University of London. Mr. Lunzer returned to Israel in 1949 and entered the Ministry of Social Welfare as Director of the Liaison Office for Foreign Relief. Since then he has held various appointments in that Ministry. He was awarded a United Nations Fellowship three years ago and spent almost a year in the United States.
