# King David schools may take boarders

A most interesting and far reaching development is being researched by the committee of the King David Foundation which administers both of our Jewish day schools the King David High

administers both of our Jewish day schools the School and the King David Primary School. In the hope that more Jewish pupils can be attracted to the schools the governors and managers feel that the schools would serve a useful purpose by accepting boys and girls from some of the smaller communities who find it difficult to provide a Jewish education for their children.

In order to cater for these children it is envisaged that a boarding house might be set up where the children would live during term

In order to assess whether or not a demand for such facilities exists the foundation has written to most

of the small communities through-out the country asking whether parents would in fact be interested in the scheme.

If the scheme does come into operation, the earliest date would be September 1975 and probably would be available to children between the ages of 5 to 15.

# Day school pl for boarders

The King David Foundation, which administers a primary school and separate high schools for boys and girls in Liverpool, is considering a plan to establish a "boarding house."

Children would be accepted from communities beyond Mersey-side which find it difficult to pro-

vide: Jewish , education. They would live in the boarding house and attend one of the King David schools, which are housed in new buildings with all modern educational facilities. They cater for 1,000 pupils who receive a full secular education as well as Jewish studies and Hebrew to "A" level exeminations. level examinations.

Parents interested in the project are asked to write to Mr David Foundation, at Rex Cohen Court, Greenbank Drive, Liver pool L17 1AB so that the demand for such a plan can be assessed.

- ★ Israel and its development to form an important part of the curriculum and constitute a factor in the moulding of the pupil's character.
- ★ A general education of the highest level.
