

Dear Rabbi Simons,

Further to our telephone conversations on Sunday last, I think it best to put into writing my message to you. The Chairman of Governors has ruled that, until such time as the Governors acting in concert with the King David Foundation Committee may authorise any change, all pupils who have been members of a Jewish Studies class at the School shall be entitled to remain so and no pupil is to be excluded or discriminated against in any way. Any separation of a pupil, even though he remain in the same room, would be considered as exclusion.

I understand that the matter will be discussed at the next meeting of the King David Foundation Committee, but meanwhile no Jewish Studies class is to be taught other than in accordance with the above ruling. In any case, I shall expect a teacher assigned to a class to remain in charge and control of that class.




